## Did you know?

#### **Football Facts**

**FACT**: The longest game in Bronco history took place on a rain soaked field in October, 2006, as the Jr. Midgets outlasted the Titans 26-25 in quadruple overtime.

**FACT**: The Broncos won their first football championship in just their second year (2003) of competition, as the Jr. Pee Wees defeated the Walkertown Wolfpack in Kernersville for the Division 2 title.

#### **Cheer Facts**

**FACT**: The Broncos won their first cheer championship in 2003 (their second season). The Jr. Pee Wee team continued on the regional championships where they had an admirable showing.

**FACT:** The 2004 Midget Cheer team was the first team to advance to the national level at the Wide World of Sports at Disney.

**Cheer Divisions:** For cheer competition, teams are divided into divisions based on size of team and skill level of the overall team. Teams must have 6 girls in order to compete and all cheer teams, ages Jr Pee Wee and up are required to participate in the competitions.

<u>Size:</u> "Small Division" is a team made up of 1 to 20 cheerleaders. "Large Division" is 21 to 35 cheerleaders.

**Skills:** There are 3 categories: Novice, Intermediate, and Advanced. This was

introduced in 2003 and attempts to make competitions more competitive between "like" teams. The skill category determines what tumbling, stunting, etc a team is allowed to do. For instance, a NOVICE team is not allowed to do a round off back handspring sequence. Skills categories for this year have been modified to allow some advanced skills to move into the intermediate level. This is fun for the girls but much more challenging for the choreography.

The goal of a team declaration is to be either a big "small" team or a big "large" team.
